The Board of Directors holds meetings outside the boundaries of the District. Upon receipt a pairtie signed by five voters in the District, the Board shall designate a meeting place and hold meetings within the District if the Board determines that the meeting place used by the District deprives the residents of a reasonable opportunity to attend District meetings. If the Board decides that the meeting place used by the Board does not deprive the residents of a reasonable opportunity to attend the meetings and the Board does not designate a meeting place within the District, five voters may petition the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality to designate such a location. If the Commission determines that the meeting place used by the District deprives the residents of a reasonable opportunity to attend District meetings, the Commission may designate a meeting place inside or outside the District which is reasonably available to the public and require that the meetings be held at such place.
